



MakeUp Artist - Party Looks

About the course

This course is all about party makeup, whether it's a birthday or Gatsby party. You will learn about different looks for different parties. You will also learn how to apply dark lipsticks, glitters, how to create Smokey eyes with nudes' lips and glamourous looks with false eye lashes.

This course is part of our specialist course offer in the beauty subject, designed to support our learners to build makeup skills for professional and personal development. To do this course, you should have the foundation skills for makeup artistry, either through completion of our beginners' course or from other experience. After completing this course, you can enrol on a progression course with us to gain more confidence in your technical skills.

*If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

*If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Select suitable products to create makeup Party Looks
- Adapt daytime makeup for evening and night looks
- Create different makeup, for a range of occasions and modes
- Prepare and use makeup and application tools in a hygienic and safe manner
- Clean and store makeup and application tools in a hygienic and appropriate manner

What are the entry requirements?

- A basic understanding of makeup artistry is required for this course, and we encourage you to complete the course Makeup Artistry for Beginners beforehand
- We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

What do I need to bring with me?

- For health and safety reasons, you will be asked to bring your own makeup and equipment:
 - Foundation(liquid)
 - o Eyeshadow palette, with dark and light colours and glitter shadows
 - o Transparent/fixing powder and blusher
 - o Lipstick, lipliner, lip gloss
 - Mascara, eyeliner (gel/liquid), eyebrow pencil/gel
 - o False eyelashes: Strip, individual and magnetic
 - Eye water line pencil (white and black)
 - o Glitter for the eyes
 - o Mirror with stand
 - Moisturizer
 - Wipes, cotton buds/pads or wool balls
- Note: No need to buy expensive new makeup. High street brands are fine, and you can bring your own everyday makeup and use it.
 - If you have questions or are unsure, your tutor can advise you in the first session.
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefore essential that you attend. If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

What can I do after completing this course?
