About the course

This qualification is designed for learners who wish to develop a range of skills and techniques essential for working in the art and design sector. This qualification will focus on the study of art and design, offer breadth and depth of study, incorporating a key core of knowledge and provide opportunities to acquire a number of practical and technical skills related to illustration.

*If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

*If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

What will I learn?

The qualification consists of the following units:

- Investigate sources of ideas in art and design
- Explore and use art and design materials, techniques and visual language
- Produce final art and design work
- Working in the art and design industry
- Building an art and design portfolio

What are the entry requirements?

- Good level of literacy to be able to produce written assignments
- Good Digital Skills
- There are no specific recommended prior learning requirements for this qualification. However, learners may find it helpful if they've already completed a basic non accredited community learning drawing and painting course or have achieved a Level 1 art & design qualification.

What equipment do I need for the course?

- The learners will do their practical work in our Art Studio and the main basic materials and resources will be provided by the centre so you can learn the requires skills and techniques.

- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes

How will my learning be assessed?

- You work will be assessed through a portfolio of evidence
- Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.
- This qualification is internally and externally (by an EQA from NCFE) quality assured.

Devices and digital applications required for online courses

As part of this course is online, access to a computer or a laptop and a good internet connection is required. We recommend that you download Google Chrome Browser.
