The intent of this qualification is to support learners to progress into employment in the Arts, Media and Publishing Industry or onto further qualifications at Level 3 in creative subjects including photography, art and design, craft, animation and moving image production.

What will I learn?

The qualification consists of the following units:

- Explore photographic equipment, techniques, materials and resources
- Develop and adapt photographic ideas
- Introduction to the photo imaging industry
- Documentary photography

What are the entry requirements?

- Good level of literacy to be able to produce written assignments
- Good Digital Skills
- There are no specific recommended prior learning requirements for this qualification. However, learners may find it helpful if they've already achieved a Level 1 photography qualification or have completed a Community Learning Photography Course with us.

What equipment do I need for the course?

- For this course you will need a photography camera, at least two different lenses, different filters, a tripod, a cable release and a macro adapter. The centre can lend you the equipment required to complete the qualification but **please note** that we would not be able to provide you with the equipment for your own camera as the equipment we have might be different to the ones suitable for your own camera. We will give you more information about the above at the Initial Assessment. How will my learning be assessed?

- You work will be assessed through a portfolio of evidence
- Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.
- This qualification is internally and externally (by an EQA from NCFE) quality assured.
