



Dressmaking - Intermediate & Advanced

About the course

This course is part of our creative specialist programme designed to enable learners to develop specific sewing and fashion skills and deepen their material and technical knowledge. The course might support your independent creative practice, support you to be able to make clothes yourself or provide additional skills as you are progressing in your creative craft learning.

On this course you will be making a garment from a prepared pattern on an intermediate or advanced level. You will develop the essential skills of transferring a pattern from paper to fabric, fitting to your measurements and create the piece using a sewing machine. To enrol on this course, you should have completed the course Dressmaking for Beginners Womenswear, or have experience of sewing clothes from patterns at home.

*If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

*If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary,you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Take body measurements and read a dressmaking pattern and understand the visual language
- Select a suitable fabric to transfer a paper pattern on to
- Use a variety of seams when completing your garment
- Complete your garment to a finished standard
- Prepare your work area in a healthy and safe way, with the equipment that you need

What are the entry requirements?

- This course is for learners who have completed the Dressmaking for Beginners course, or who have experience of sewing from patterns at home
- However, you should have basic knowledge of sewing, and we recommend you to do an Introduction to Sewing Machine course beforehand.
- To access this course basic digital skills are essential. We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

What do I need to bring with me?

- Essential resources will be provided, but if you wish to use a specific fabric you will need to purchase this yourself. Discuss this with your tutor beforehand. You will be provided with a pattern for a specific piece of garment.
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefore essential that you attend. If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us

know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

What can I do after completing this course?

- The most obvious pathway after this course would be to further develop your skills on progression courses in dressmaking. You might also be interested in learning pattern cutting skills or to gain a L2 Textile Qualification.
