



# **Sewing Machine Beginner Techniques**

#### About the course

This course is part of our creative specialist programme designed to enable learners to build the basic sewing machine skills so to develop their practice in textiles and applied arts. Once you have completed this course you might wish to continue your sewing practice on progression sewing courses, or through a Level 2 qualification in Creative Arts to gain professional skills.

On this course you will add to your functional sewing machine skills with more advanced techniques, to enable you to carry out sewing projects such as making simple garments. For this, you will also practice the use of different sewing machine feet. This course is technical and you will mainly be doing exercises and complete sewing samples, and will apply your learning in one practical project. All samples will be made on plain cotton fabric.

\*If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

\*If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary,you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

#### What will I learn?

# After this course you will be able to:

- Identify a few different sewing machine feet and know how to change them
- Insert and stitch a centered zipper
- Insert and stich a hidden zipper
- Stitch simple curved seams, by applying slashing and pulling
- Stitch corners (square)

- Stitch ruffles, with one piece of fabric longer than the other
- Use and care for the sewing machine and other tools and equipment in a healthy and safe manner. Tools include scissors, measuring tape, pins, needles, unpicker, iron and pressing tools, tailors chalk.

### What are the entry requirements?

- To enrol on this course, you should have completed the course Sewing Machine Introduction
- We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

### What do I need to bring with me?

- Resources will be provided
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes
- Please note that you can not bring your own sewing machine to class, since this is not PAT tested with us.

# How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefore essential that you attend. If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us

know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

- After this course, we recommend that you continue learning on Sewing Machine Intermediate, to develop functional skills for using a sewing machine
