*If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

*If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

About the course

This course is a part of our Pottery Specialist Programmes aimed at those who would like to learn pottery skills and techniques to pursue a career in Pottery and Ceramics or other related sectors within Creative Industries. Our Pottery Specialist Programmes offer both accredited (qualification) and not-accredited (non-qualification) courses up to L2 (GSCE equivalent).

This course is ideal for those who have completed throwing for Beginners with us or elsewhere.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Demonstrate awareness of health and safety issues in ceramics through safe studio practice, with consideration towards others
- Gain further skills in the fundamental throwing techniques eg. centring, opening out and pulling up
- Work on your own self-directed projects, with support and guidance from our experienced tutor glaze and decorate your own work
- Understand how you can progress your work further

What are the entry requirements?

- To be eligible for this course you must be 19 or over on the start date of the course.
- You must be at Intermediate level or above. Although there will be a tutor available for demonstrations and support, this course will not be structurally taught course like many of our others

What do I need to bring with me for the first lesson?

- All materials are included in the course fees
- Please wear closed toe shoes

- Apron
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes
- You may wish to bring in a protective glaze mask (level3/V3) do not worry about this for your first lesson

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.
