^{*}If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

About the course

^{*}If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

This course is a part of our Pottery Specialist Programmes aimed at those who would like to learn pottery skills and techniques to pursue a career in Pottery and Ceramics or other related sectors within Creative Industries. Our Pottery Specialist Programmes offer both accredited (qualification) and not-accredited (non-qualification) courses up to L2 (GSCE equivalent).

This course is ideal for those who have completed Hand-building for Beginners with us or elsewhere.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Demonstrate awareness of health and safety issues in ceramics through safe studio practice, with consideration towards others
- Develop and awareness of historical and contemporary approaches in ceramic decoration by learning about other artists
- Sgraffito decorating to scratch illustrations onto leather-hard clay. Mono-printing with cobalt oxide to create mark-making and tonal drawings onto soft clay
- Printing and painting onto leather hard clay with under glaze colours and slips and using resist techniques such as was, paper stencils, objects and leaves
- Learning many forms of glazing techniques such as pouring, dipping, painting and glaze on glaze applications

What are the entry requirements?

- To be eligible for this course you must be 19 or over on the start date of the course.
- You must be at Intermediate level or above

What do I need to bring with me?

- All materials are included in the course fees
- Please wear closed toe shoes

- Apron
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes
- You may wish to bring in a protective glaze mask (level3/V3) do not worry about this for your first lesson

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefor essential that you attend. If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

What can I do after completing this course?

- The most obvious progression pathway after this is **The Art of Pottery and Ceramics- From Design to Exhibitions**. However, your tutor will give you a more specific advice on what you could do next at the end of the course based on your personal circumstances.
