**If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.*

**If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.*

About the course

This course is suitable for learners with some experience of pottery, who are ready to take their craft skills into a professional practice. You will be given the task of designing a kitchenware collection and will be guided through the process of making one set of plates and cups. This will develop your skills of design research and planning, repetition in making and designing for a specific audience.

This course is part of our Designed & Made in Hounslow programme, with courses designed to support you to grow as an artist and entrepreneur. You will gain craft knowledge from experienced tutors and receive the essential skills for promoting your own handcrafted designs commercially. After completion of the course you will be given a platform to sell your items at the Design & Made in Hounslow markets and pop-up shops at no cost; A real life experience of trading at craft fairs. The dates for the market is December 9th-11th and it will take place at Meadowbank Centre.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Prepare and initiate your workspace and materials in a clean and safe manner
- Design and make your own kitchenware collection in ceramics, with at least 2 cups, 2 sets of plates
- Package your materials in a safe and attractive manner
- Price and label your handcrafted products
- Display and trade your handmade work at markets

What are the entry requirements?

- There are no specific entry requirements for this course.
- We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

What do I need to bring with me?

- Essential equipment and tools will be provided
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes.

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. **Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefore essential that you attend.** If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

What can I do after completing this course?

- The most obvious next step after this course would be to develop your microbusiness for markets or online trading, independently or with the support from one of our business courses. You might also want to further develop your creative practice, for example by progressing to a Level 2 qualification in Creative Crafts.
