^{*}If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

About the course

This course is part of our business learning programme aimed to support local residents into starting their own small business or growing the existing one.

^{*}If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary,you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

This course would be ideal for those who are considering starting a business in fashion. On the course you will be exploring the nuances of a fashion business, such as selling apparel and accessories as well as fashion services including styling and alterations. You will also learn all that you need to know to take your first steps in fashion entrepreneurship.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Identify the key elements of a fashion business
- Utilise fashion forecasts & anthropometric information to optimise inventory and fashion services
- Understand different structures in which fashion businesses operate
- Comprehend the monetary & other skills required for the prospective business idea

What are the entry requirements?

- This course is for beginners with little or no previous knowledge of fashion business. However, to access this course a good level of written English & basic digital skills is essential
- We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

What do I need to bring with me?

- This is an online course please see the 'Devices and Digital Applications Required for Online Courses' section below
- Please ensure that you attend classes using a laptop/desktop. Mobiles & tablets can be used for live meets interaction, but sometimes do not support different formats in which assignments are to be completed.
- You may wish to bring a piece of paper and a pen to take notes

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefor essential that you attend. If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

Devices and digital applications required for online courses

This is an interactive online course which requires access to a good internet connection and a device with a camera and microphone. We recommend that you download Google Chrome browser if using a laptop or PC. For tablets and smartphones, we recommend you download the Google Meet and Google Classroom apps.

What can I do after completing this course?
