About the course

This course is part of our Family Learning Programmes. There are two types of Family Learning Programmes, FEML and WFL, and this course is part of our FEML offer.

FEML Programmes are aimed to give parents and carers the opportunity to find out how things are taught in their children's schools, as well as a chance to share ideas with other parents and develop their own skills. (*for WFL course please see our WFL programme offer)

The intent of this course is to support parents and carers to understand the National Curriculum for mathematics and English and how these link to all subjects within the National Curriculum. We hope that this course will enable you to support your child's learning through fun and interesting activities.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Demonstrate that you understand the national Curriculum for Mathematics and English
- Select a range of activities and resources from the National Curriculum for English and mathematics to use with your child at home to support their learning
- Understand how English and mathematics are embedded in other subjects within the National curriculum
- Use your English and mathematics skills to support your child's learning in subjects such as Science, History and Geography

What are the entry requirements?

- This course is for those who have a child/ren in Year 1 or 2 (Ages 5-7)

What do I need to bring with me?

- We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start

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How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. **Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefore essential that you attend.** If you for any reason are unable to attend, please let us know and ensure that you read through the induction slides located in your Google Classroom and complete any related tasks.

Devices and digital applications required for online courses

We recommend that you download Google Chrome browser if using a laptop or PC. For tablets and smartphones, we recommend you download the Google Meet and Google Classroom apps.
