^{*}If you are unemployed, looking for work, and are in receipt of a means tested benefit, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to sign a self-declaration form stating that you are looking for a job and provide supporting evidence.

About the course

^{*}If you are in low paid employment and you earn less than £10.85p/h or £21,157.59 annual gross salary, you do not have to pay the course fees. You will need to provide proof of income, for example, this could be a wage slip within 3 months of the course start date, or a current employment contract, which states gross monthly/annual wages.

On this course you will learn the processes and techniques of oil painting, a versatile and vibrant artistic medium with a rich history. You will be guided through the steps of preparing a canvas, explore mark making and different brush strokes, and sealing the paint at the end. Step by step you will explore the potential of this art technique of the old masters, while making a painting of your own.

This course is part of our creative art specialist programme designed to enable learners to develop their practice in visual arts. Once you have completed this course you might continue your learning on a course aimed at personal painting projects, or continue to Oil Painting for Improvers.

What will I learn?

After this course you will be able to:

- Prime a canvas for oil painting
- · Identify the characteristics of oil paints and how to make these come to best use while painting
- Finish and seal a painting with the use of varnish
- Recall the importance of brush strokes, pressure and orientation in an oil painting
- Use and care for tools and equipment for oil painting, and how to clean them safely

What are the entry requirements?

- This course is suitable for complete beginners, or learners who are painting but wish to deepen their technical skills
- We use Google Suite for Education to record your learning journey. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

What do I need to bring with me?

• All essential resources will be provided

How will my learning be assessed?

This is a non-accredited course with the intent to benefit lifelong learning. Your tutor will give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To successfully complete the course your attendance should be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed by the end of the course. Please note that the first session is an induction to the course and the centre, so it is therefore essential that you attend.
