About the course

This FREE 12-week course is for anyone wishing to improve your digital skills to improve your life and for work. If you have some experience in using a computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone to access the Internet then this course is for you.

The first 6 lessons will be face to face at our Meadowbank Adult Education Centre.

During this course you will develop your digital skills and learn about how to use digital technology.

The course will be **online** using Google Meet.

You will track your progress by accessing your electronic individual learning plan (ILP), at the start and at the end of the course. You will respond to questions and feedback in the Google Classroom.

What will I learn?

By the end of the course you will be able to:

- Use and manage your devices and your data storage; deal with simple technical problems
- Find your way around online; search for information and content to use
- Create, improve and save files of different kinds, offline and online
- Use digital communications for different audiences (email, chat, videocall etc)
- Work with online forms; approach online buying safely
- Work safely and responsibly online; protect your well-being.

What are the entry requirements?

- Initial Assessment All learners will do an Initial Assessment before the course starts to establish suitability for the course.
- A laptop or desktop computer is required to attend the course with a reliable Internet connection and a generous data plan if accessing the Internet through mobile data. Please discuss with our team not having a device or internet should not be a barrier to your taking part in this course.

What do I need to bring with me?

- You may wish to have some paper and a pen to take notes

How will my learning be assessed?

This is an accredited course and at the end of the course you will sit an exam and can achieve an Entry 3 qualification in Essential Digital Skills.

Your tutor will also give you regular verbal and written feedback to support your progression. You will submit your course work and track your learning in Google Classroom. You will participate in group discussions and receive guidance.

To achieve on this course we expect your attendance to be a minimum of 85% and course work should be completed on time.

Devices and digital applications required for online courses

This is an interactive online course which requires access to a good internet connection and a device with a camera and microphone. We recommend that you download Google Chrome browser if using a laptop or PC.

We use Google Suite for Education. If you are a new learner with us, we will create an account for you. Details will be sent to your personal email so please check your inbox and spam regularly prior to course start.

What can I do after completing this course?

- At the end of the course your tutor can also advise you on your possible next steps.
- You could enrol onto the Essential Digital Skills Level 1 course
- You could enrol on any of our Community Learning courses and/or selected Adult Skills courses (some of which require an initial assessment).
